

## Science

In science we will be learning about **living things and their habitats**.

We will be able to describe the differences in life-cycles of a mammal, an amphibian, an insect and a bird. We will also describe the processes of reproduction in some plants.



Our key scientist is **David Attenborough**, who creates wildlife documentaries and has a passion for conservation.

## Art

This half term we will have one art lesson per week, on Tuesday afternoon.

In art we will be exploring the life and work of American artist, Andy Warhol, famous for his striking and colourful style of pop art.

Children will be encouraged to observe and offer facts about the artwork of Andy Warhol and adapt some of his artistic techniques into their own art, including combining colours, tones and tints to enhance the mood of a piece.



## Reading

In our reading lessons, we will continue reading a variety of quality fiction and non-fiction texts and answer comprehension questions about them.

Children are expected to read for **20 minutes each night** and **record a summary** of what they have read in their reading records.

Please make sure your child brings in to school their school **reading book** and **reading record every day**.

## PSHE



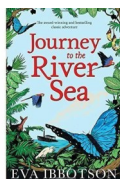
Our values focus this half term is: **Being Me and My World.**

## Writing

Using this text as inspiration, we will be writing for different purposes and audiences, including setting descriptions, diary entries and non-fiction information leaflets about the Amazon.



Our spelling and grammar focuses are;

- Constructing main clauses
- Expanding sentences using subordinate clauses
- Using parenthesis

## Maths

This half term, we will be focusing on **place value**. We will learn to read, write, order and compare numbers up to 1,000,000, knowing the value of each digit.

We will also expand on our knowledge of Roman numerals, learning to recognise numerals up to 1000 (M).

We will also cover **addition and subtraction**. We will add and subtract numbers with more than 4 digits using column method, including regrouping.

In year 5, children are expected to be very fluent with their times tables and division facts up to 12x. Please practise on Times Table Rockstars each night.

## RE

This half term our learning will aim to answer this key question - *What do the miracles of Jesus teach?*

We will learn about the core concept **incarnation**, understand a variety of miracles performed by Jesus and explain how these tell us that Jesus is the Son of God.

## PE

PE will take place on **Thursday mornings**.

Please make sure that your child has the correct PE kit each week.

This term's focus is **netball**.



## Homework

Homework is handed out each week on Friday and should be returned to school the following **Tuesday**.

Please encourage your child to use Spelling Shed and Times Table Rockstars each night. These are a fun way for your child to practice their weekly spellings and increase their times tables fluency.
