1451	Christopher Columbus was born in Genoa, Italy.			
1492	Christopher Columbus landed on an island in The Bahamas, which he called San Salvador.			
1930	Neil Armstrong was born in Ohio, America on August 5.			
1969	Apollo 11 set off on its mission to the Moon on July 16. Neil Armstrong was the commanding officer, with Buzz Aldrin and Michael Collins his crewmates.			
1969	Neil Armstrong became the first human to set foot on the Moon on July 21, 1969.			
2010	Dwayne Fields became the first black Briton to walk over 400 nautical miles to the North Pole.
